

DESCRIPTION AND GENERAL DETAILS.

History.—Chester, the oldest settlement in the State, is situated on the right bank of the Delaware, 15 miles by river and 14 miles by rail south from Philadelphia, with which it is connected by the Philadelphia, Wilmington & Baltimore Railroad and the Philadelphia & Reading Railroad. Its latitude north is 39° 50′ 45″ longitude from Washington 1° 39′ 27″ east, and from Greenwich 75° 22′ 5″ west. It was constituted a corporate town as early as 1690. The ground on which it is built was at one time the bed of the Delaware river, the channel of the latter being 32 feet deep opposite the city. The Indian name given to Chester is Mecoponaca. The Swedes named it Upland, and William Penn named it Chester in compliment to his friend Pearson, who was his compagnon du voyage from Europe, who requested that it should be called "Chester, in remembrance of the city from whence I came."

The first record of a court is in 1676, and of a Chester county court 1681. In 1682 Chester is named for the first time upon its records.

EXTENT.—The city extends from Lamokin creek on the west to Ridley creek on the east, and from Upland Borough on the north to the Delaware river on the south, and contains three wards, viz.: North, South and Middle.

HEALTH.—Chester is peculiarly exempt from miasmatic diseases, as the tides of the Delaware carry off every source of malaria. The well water is impregnated with chalybeate and saline matter, whose medicinal qualities contribute to the general health. The spring water is of the purest kind, which contributes much to the superiority of the celebrated Delaware county butter, so much sought after in the markets of Philadelphia and other cities. Exceptional to the diseases on water

courses, Chester has very few if any agues or intermittent fevers, and the health of the city is attested by the oldest inhabitants. Dysentery is seldom known here, and the typhoid is rare. Liver complaints and bilious complaints find no footbold in this city

POPULATION.—In 1702 it "was a bare place, without a fort, but there were some houses built there." In 1708 "one hundred houses," or say 500 population. In 1820, 657. In 1830, 848. In 1840, 1,000. on 1850, 1,667. In 1859, at the time the first directory was published by Mr. William Whitehead, 4,107. In 1870, 9,485. In 1879, we estimate it by well established rules at 15,888.

INTELLIGENCE, STATE OF SOCIETY, &c .- "In early times the social feeling and hospitality of the citizens of Chester were well marked," says a writer. Mrs. Logan's experience was, that "the people were simple-hearted and affectionate. Little distinction of rank was known, but all were honest and kind." The same lady called the period of her youth in Chester "the silver age." This was before the days of railroads and telegraphs, of cotton and woolen mills, of sugar refineries, and iron ships; when the people were native and homogeneous. The publisher of the first directory of Chester, Mr. Whitehead, said in his book that he "can add his testimony to the effect that in a canvass of the Borough for the Directory of 1859, he was received with a uniform kindness by the citizens, and in no instance received an insulting or unkind reply to the many inquiries he had to make," to which the writer and the canvasser for the Chester City Directory of 1879 can subscribe, as having the same experience with and receiving the same treatment from the natives and their descendants. This he states as significant, when it is a well known fact that to be a directory man in Chester, was no recommendation.

GAS AND WATER.—Gas was introduced into Chester in 1856. Previous to 1859, wells and pumps supplied the public with water. During that year an artesian well was sunk by Mr. Samuel Eccles, to supply water for his manufactory.
