FINE NEW STATION TO BE BUILT HERE – Chester to Have a Splendid Passenger Depot – Will Cost about \$125,000

Now that the work of elevating the Pennsylvania tracks from Eddystone through this city and out of it, is progressing, the company is giving attention to the proposed new station. Indeed, it is stated on excellent authority that the plans have been prepared already and that they provide for a structure that will be a credit to the city.

It has been the intention of the company for some time to put up a building and there was appropriated about \$20,000 for this purpose. A prominent citizen who is influential with the powers that be, hearing of this, and believing that the interests of the company deserved a heated building, had a conference with President Caseatt of the railroad. The result is that the directors have set aside the sum of \$125,000 and one of the finest buildings along the company's property will be the result.

The building will be located on the south side of the tracks. It will be commodious and of the most modern style of architecture. The grounds about it will be adorned with landscape gardening which will be under the supervision of the company's expert in this department. It is given out that an effort will be made to finish the present elevated undertaking within a year.
