COMPLETE NEW LIBRARY AT CLIFTON HEIGHTS

The stately old mansion on Baltimore Avenue in the East ward which has been remodeled and renovated, for the use of a public library is expected to be open for inspection on Thursday evening of this week. This building is a large structure which is adapted for library purpose. Every room has been repainted and repapered, and a large heating plant has been installed in the basement. It is understood that the young women of the borough will be given an opportunity to learn the art of sewing and needle work, and that a good library will be one of the chief assets for the young working men of the borough. The work of remodeling the building has been in charge of a committee of which Chief Burgess N. S. Keay is at the head.
